**Notice:** On June 1, 2026, Illinois Governor JB Pritzker signed HB4154 into law. This legislation replaces the current pharmacy jurisprudence examination requirement with an Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE)-approved Illinois pharmacy law education and assessment program developed by the Illinois Pharmacists Association (IPhA) in cooperation with the Illinois Department of Financial & Professional Regulation (IDFPR). The program will be known as the Illinois Pharmacist Readiness and Orientation Program (ILPRO) and will continue to ensure that applicants have a strong foundation in the laws, responsibilities, and professional standards that define pharmacy practice in Illinois. Additionally, licensees will be required to provide evidence of completion of two hours of continuing education in the subject of pharmacy law every renewal cycle following their first renewal.

The new law allows for applicants to complete the ILPRO or *any other such program and assessment or test approved by the Department by rule*. Presently, IDFPR will continue to accept the MultiState Pharmacy Jurisprudence Exam (MPJE) as a method of examination for licensure pursuant to 68 Ill. Admin. Code 1330.330.

**Applicants who have completed the NAPLEX through Continental Testing Services (CTS) or applicants utilizing a NAPLEX Score Transfer should contact CTS at [pharmacy@continentaltesting.net](mailto:pharmacy@continentaltesting.net) to communicate their intention to complete the ILPRO instead of the MPJE. Please provide your full name, last 4 digits of your SSN, your date of birth, and the following statement: I would like to waive the IL MPJE exam.**

Please note that this is an unresponsive email, but CTS will be keeping track of this waiver email to help facilitate the exam-licensing process when NAPLEX scores for each applicant are forwarded to IDFPR. We appreciate your patience in the transition and introduction of this new exam method for licensure.

**Applicants who have been licensed in another state for more than a year and who have applied to IDFPR under the Endorsement licensure method do not need to contact CTS but should allow 2-3 weeks for IPhA to forward their completion to IDFPR and for IDFPR to update the application record.**
